



## Choosing lug styles:

If you've read my blurb on choosing paint this one will sound quite similar, as it should since paint and lug style should go together!

- 1) Choose a stock lug style. There some nice lugs already out there, so if you don't feel the need to customize you don't have to. Henry James, Richard Sachs, and Kalavinka are my main options all listed here: <http://jonnycycles.com/lugs.php>
- 2) This is my favorite: Give me a general idea on style and let me go from there. Send me a few photos of examples you like, or a general description: long and pointy, curvy, asymmetrical, really whatever comes to mind! If you like what you've seen on my website then you will probably like what I come up with.
- 3) If you want a little more control over lug style you can request that I send you a sketch for approval. Usually I'll draw something out on a lug and send a photo. I have no problem with doing this and a little back and forth with the design is often fun, however do keep in mind that this increase in time will increase the time of the frame. If you're really picky about your lugs the cost will likely be worth it!

Is there any lug style I won't do? Yes, I reserve to right to refuse certain styles. I don't have any specific examples, but if it's wildly different than what you see on my site I may not like it, or maybe I will. At the least it doesn't hurt to ask, I promise I won't insult your ideas but rather politely decline or make some suggestions to modify things in a way more along the lines of what's feasible.
